- The National Honor Society purchased turkeys and collected canned goods to deliver to Dansville families in need of food for Thanksgiving. They then collaborated with the HS PALS to provide Christmas food and gifts for our Aggie Family members in need. Our students, staff and several community members donated, which helped us to adopt 11 middle school and high school families for the holidays.
