## Superintendent Report: August Board Meeting Submitted on August 23, 2023

#### ADMINISTRATIVE WORK:

August is the most wonderful time of the year! The administrative team spent the day on August 1 at a retreat to plan and prepare for the upcoming year. Our focus was heavily on new teacher orientation, opening day activities, school improvement planning, and safety. We ended the day visiting students at the Ingham County Fair followed by the ribbon cutting at IISD's new North Star School.

We changed our new teacher orientation to a new <u>staff</u> orientation with new hires staying for a half day and teachers staying for two full days. We dove deep into culture: who we are and what we value in Dansville. Day two was heavily focused on instructional and assessment practices as well as classroom management and setup.

Opening day with staff was a blast! We were blessed to be able to give away donated prizes to help welcome staff back. We trained all employees in CPR / AED / First Aid. Our afternoon was spent learning more about resiliency and the well-being of our educators. Opportunity Thrive was well received, and we will be continuing this work during staff meetings.

We are excited to be rolling out a new feature in the transportation department: **Here Comes the Bus.** This app allows parents to track their child's bus to know exactly when the bus stops at home (for latchkey children) and to know when the bus may arrive when there are unexpected delays. Safety is naturally embedded as only people who are directly connected to students will have the ability to track the route. Accounts are set up based on the child's UIC, which is a state-provided number.

We were unable to provide in-person Spanish instruction this year due to the resignation of Sarah Saucedo. This was a difficult decision made after exhausting several different recruiting attempts and creative options. Mr. Andrew's letters to families said it best, "This [decision] will allow us to provide [students] with the best instructional setting possible under the direction of an Aggie-caliber educator in the future." We look forward to this year-long opportunity to find the best person to teach foreign language at Dansville Schools.

#### FACILITIES:

Ms. Dupuis has been working with a small committee to select a spot within the building to commemorate Ms. Linsey Ebert. We wanted to be very intentional in this process and not make decisions when emotions were running high; but, it is now time to move forward with this project. After the first meeting on August 7, it appears the direction the committee is moving is to name the middle school commons after Ms. Ebert.

The elementary HVAC project was completed on time and on budget! That is something to celebrate! We are now shifting our focus to the aging and, in one case, broken rooftop units over the middle school. The district initiated an invitation to bid. Bids were opened on August 17. We

are still in the process of analyzing the bids and will bring a recommendation to the board at our September meeting:

The County Drain Commissioner visited this summer to provide a quick analysis of our parking lot situation: slow drainage after rain events. They assisted with snaking the drains closest to the pond. At some point, we may need to consider dredging our pond to ensure the most efficient flow of water off our grounds.

Rick Miller and I worked on critical mapping of the buildings and grounds this summer to assist law enforcement and first responders in the event of a crisis. This project is now complete.

On behalf of Dansville Schools, Rick and I are participating in a statewide infrastructure study with the School Finance Research Foundation. The purpose of the study is to perform facility condition assessments of all K-12 educational school buildings owned by the Local Education Agencies (LEAs) in the state to provide a better understanding of their current condition as well as identify necessary capital improvements (and associated costs) regarding health, safety, and wellness. This data will serve as a critical input to support requests for necessary funding from the state legislature.
