- The winter FAST Bridge screening was completed in January. Data has been analyzed within our grade level teams to determine which interventions need to be intensified or scaled back as appropriate especially when determining flexible small group instruction. This data is also used to help determine students who should receive Aggie Academy invitations (summer school).
- Kindergarten and Begindergarten Round Up is coming up Wednesday, March 4th from 4:00-6:30. This is an important date for us to get an idea about enrollment numbers for next year's newest Aggies. Please help spread the word!
- Mrs. Provencal's student-adult book club begins this month with 30 families signed up to participate. Sue does a tremendous job with this project which incorporates deep level discussion and arts integration activities that Mrs. Hekman will help lead.
- Big plans are under way to make Reading Month a major success throughout the month of March. Special guest visits, reading trackers, prizes, mystery guest readers and special dress up days are all a part of the festivities of Reading Month. Our theme this year is "Read Like It's Your Job" and will be focused on careers. A Read-A-Thon fundraiser is also happening during this busy month. Students can ask friends and family for donations to read during specific reading sessions at school.
