# <u>Superintendent Report: September Board Meeting</u> Submitted on September 22, 2022

# **ADMINISTRATIVE WORK:**

September is when things get "real" in schools. We are past the first few honeymoon days of the new school year. Our administrators are busy daily with parent and student conversations, visiting classrooms, and meeting with teachers to set professional growth plans for the year. We work hard to ensure that individual professional goals are aligned to the district improvement plan.

Another lingering task from COVID-19 legislation is K-8 benchmark goals and assessments for reading and math. Non-K-8 programs must also post one academic goal. We are required to report our progress on these goals in February and before the end of the year.

# **COMMUNICATION:**

Free meals for all students through the National School Lunch Program has ended. We've been working extremely hard to get the word out that families must complete the Free/Reduced Lunch application if they need assistance with school meals. Having families complete this application is also critical to much of the funding we receive for serving at-risk children. Specifically, it can affect certain grant applications, such as Title I and II, 31a, private grants, and eRate (for subsidized technology-related purchases).

We continue to work on our fall newsletter which should be released any day now.

#### **FACILITIES:**

There will be a special presentation on Monday night from Matrix Engineering to review the air quality project for the elementary school.

Daktronics, who manufactures electronic signs, has had a change in personnel. The representative we were working with to get the signs ordered is no longer with the company, so Mrs. Jones and I are having to investigate the status of our order.

Mr. Andrews and Markas Hamlin, student board of education representative, will be taking over athletic updates.

#### SAFETY:

SetSeg conducted a safety walk-through on August 24 with Mr. Miller and me. The loss control consultant provided feedback on practices we could improve to create a safer environment for students and staff. Ingham Township Fire Department also performed a walk-through of our buildings on September 6 and 7. The inspector was able to provide feedback as well on additional items that would enhance the safety of our schools.

Mr. Jon Harpst is helping to coordinate a test of our lockdown systems on the afternoon of our professional development day, 9/28.
