High School Board Updates

- The members of the National Honor Society hosted a food drive to collect donations for our Many Hands weekend food bags, which help many of our Aggies each week.
- The high school class advisors worked with students to organize a twist to the traditional Homecoming Week activities with a "Stay-at-Homecoming" Week. Students had an opportunity to participate in a variety fun events including spirit days, a fence decorating contest, and a drive-in movie.
