
High School Board Report

June 2023

- 1. Class of 2023 Graduation: It was a true pleasure to be a part of this year's celebration of the Class of 2023! We graduated 69 students and although they will be missed we're confident they will do well in their next endeavors. This class was quite accomplished. They started their high school career during a pandemic and, in true Aggie fashion, still managed to excel!
 - a. **46** of our students are graduating today with Honors.
 - b. **30** students took LCC courses over this last year and **6** of our seniors are graduating today with at least **28** college credits from LCC.
 - i. Melody Baker, completed 40 credits earning her a Transfer Studies Certificate of Achievement!
 - c. 13 of our seniors participated in concert and/or jazz band. 16 seniors participated in our Drama Club and 5 were honored at this year's Senior Night for their artistic abilities.
 - d. Our FFA chapter also had significant accomplishments this year. All of the seniors competed in Leadership Contests, and Sasha Sherrick placed 7th in the state for public speaking. Katie Meade, Danielle Erisman, and Sasha Sherrick all earned their State Degrees.
 - e. These seniors have also had great success as student-athletes, with 10 of them being honored as CMAC Scholar-Athletes this year. Several of these seniors were part of the Boy's Cross Country, Volleyball, Boys Basketball, and Football teams that earned Academic All-State Team Honors. Our senior gals helped our Volleyball team earn a District Title and the Basketball team to with both the CMAC Conference Championship and the District Championship. Elizabeth Carpenter, Allie Grice, Kourtney Mack, Zacharay Sykes, Gracie Taylor, and Maggie Kodish all have roster spots to continue competing in sports in college.

- f. **4** of our athletes earned the CMAC All-League designation, **3** earned All-Area, **2** were All-State Honorable Mention, **2** were Academic All-State.
- g. They left with \$882,836 in scholarships and grants to pursue furthering their education. 52 of these seniors plan to attend college,
 9 are moving on to trade and/or apprenticeship programs, 1 intends to serve in the armed forces, and 7 plan to join the rest of us in the workforce.









- 2. **Advanced Placement Classes:** Several high school students took their Advanced Placement exams for various AP classes offered at Dansville High School. This test provides data and feedback for the teachers, and it provides students an opportunity to earn college credit.
- 3. **Credit Recovery:** A few high school students are working in summer school to recover credits toward graduation. Several have already finished and a few more should be done by the end of the month. High school students will have an opportunity to work with a teacher in each subject area throughout the summer.
- 4. **Bullying 2023:** The district has adopted this definition from the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program to use when handling student conflict: "Bullying is when someone repeatedly and on purpose says or does mean or hurtful things to another person who as a hard time defending himself or herself. The three key components of bullying behavior are: (1) Involves an imbalance of power and strength; (2) Involves a pattern of behavior over time; and (3) Involves an aggressive behavior."

There were **zero** instances of bullying at Dansville High School during the 2023-2024 school year.
