They then collaborated with the HS PALS to provide Christmas food and gifts for our Aggie Family members in need. Our students, staff and several community members donated, which helped us to adopt 11 families for the holidays.

- Dansville's FFA chapter sponsored the annual Mistletoe Dance, which had record attendance this year. The kids had a wonderful time at the special event.
- Dansville's National Honor Society partnered with the Red Cross to run a Blood Drive, which provided 34 pints of blood for people in need.
- Dansville High School students had an opportunity to go on a college visit to the University
