High School Board Report

June 2025

- 1. Class of 2025 Graduation: It was a true pleasure to be a part of this year's celebration of the Class of 2025! This class was quite accomplished!
 - a. These Seniors have displayed success both in and out of the classroom, as 35 of our students are graduating today with Honors. 11 seniors have filled seats in advanced placement classes and many took dual enrollment classes at Lansing Community College, Ferris State University, Baker College, Davenport University and Washtenaw Community College. Over their time here they have enrolled in 83 college classes. Audree Prather, Brandon Ide, Rebekah Hallock, Faith Caroen, and Alina Broyles earned 24 credits Mariah Mayhew earned 28 credits and Ethan Root, Hailey Meeker, and Hannah Burnham earned 32 credits from Dual Enrollment! Let's celebrate these hard-working students.
 - b. Their accomplishments don't stop there, however. **26** students attended Wilson Talent Center earning numerous certifications and awards including Skills Competition Placements, a first place ranking in the state, and participation in National competitions.
 - c. The Class of 2025 also excelled in the arts. **8** of our seniors participated in concert and/or jazz band. **Jessika Ivy** led the Marching Band as drum Major.
 - d. 7 seniors participated in our Drama Club. Ella Bloom and Kaylee Smith were honored at this year's Senior Night for their 4 years of participation in our performances.
 - e. We also had seniors who participated in Dansville FFA activities throughout the year including: attending Regional and State workshops and conventions, making apple cider, raising broiler chickens, and collecting sap to make maple syrup. Congratulations to this year's Chapter President Liz Dase, who received her State Degree and Academic Excellence Award at State Convention and was the alternate to Regionals in the Job Interview Contest. Chapter Vice President Sophia Parent earned her State Degree and Academic Excellence Award at State Convention. She also participated in multiple Leadership Contests throughout the year, taught record keeping workshops here at Dansville and was the top points earner in our chapter throughout her time in High School.
 - f. These seniors have also had great success as student-athletes, with 7 of them being honored as CMAC Scholar-Athletes this year. Several of these seniors were part of the Volleyball, Boys Basketball & Wrestling teams which earned Academic All-State Team Honors. Theo Davis was the CMAC Champion, Regional Champion and, along with Ethan Root ran on the Cross-Country State Qualifying team.

 Aubree Mayr was a District & Regional Champion. Faith Caroen, Theo Davis &

Wyatt Mosley all have roster spots to continue competing in sports at the collegiate level. 11 of our senior athletes earned a CMAC All-League designation; 6 earned All-Area; Anthony Pawlowski was All-State Honorable Mention; Alex Baker, Theo Davis & Aubree Mayr were All-State; Dakota Barnett, Faith Caroen, Theo Davis, Aubree Mayr, Brianna Richardson & Ryan Simpson were Academic All-State, and none of that includes the accolades we will surely see this Spring.

g. And they don't stop there. This class will leave with hundreds of thousands of dollars in scholarships and grants to pursue furthering their education. Many of them are receiving the Community College Guarantee or the Michigan Achievement Scholarship through the State of Michigan to help pay for their post-secondary plans. 30 of these seniors plan to attend a community college to obtain their Associates degrees in various programs, 16 students plan to attend a four year University to obtain Bachelor degrees, 3 students are joining apprenticeship type programs, 2 intend to serve in the armed forces, and 6 plan to join the rest of us in the workforce.





- Credit Recovery: In the month of June, some high school students are working in summer school to recover credits toward graduation. Several have already finished and a few more should be done by the end of the month.
- 3. Summer Melt: We will continue providing assistance to our graduates through our Summer Melt program. This program provides a mentor to student who choose to participate who will help students work through the tasks leading up to starting college in teh fall.
- 4. **Bullying 2025:** The district has adopted this definition from the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program to use when handling student conflict: "Bullying is when someone repeatedly and on purpose says or does mean or hurtful things to another person who as a hard time defending himself or herself. The three key components of bullying behavior are: (1) Involves an imbalance of power and strength; (2) Involves a pattern of behavior over time; and (3) Involves an aggressive behavior."

There were **zero** instances of bullying at Dansville High School during the 2024-2025 school year.
