

## High School Board Report

June 2026

1. **Class of 2026 Graduation:** It was a true pleasure to be a part of this year's celebration of the Class of 2026! This class was quite accomplished!

These Seniors have displayed success both in and out of the classroom, as **25** of our students are graduating today with Honors. **15** seniors have filled seats in advanced placement classes, and many students pursued dual enrollment classes at Lansing Community College. Over their time here, they have enrolled in **84** college classes. **Brianna DeLano and Riley Graf** earned **24** credits, **Madyson Smith** earned **28**, **Grace Sagamang** earned **32** credits and **Preston Maxey, Joseph McMillan, and Cadence Rigg** earned close to **40** credits from Dual Enrollment! Can we celebrate these hard-working students.

Their accomplishments don't stop there, however. **20** students attended Wilson Talent Center, earning numerous certifications and awards, including Skills Competition Placements, a first-place ranking in the state, and participation in National competitions.

The Class of 2026 also excelled in the arts. **6** of our seniors participated in concert and/or jazz band and **Brianna DeLano & Hope Service** led the Pride of the Aggies as Drum Majors.

**3** seniors participated in all four years of our Drama Club and have been invaluable members of the group over the years, both on stage and behind the scenes. **Jaysha Ivy, Margo Kuznicki, and Victoria Stanislawski** were honored at this year's Senior Night for their **4** years of participation in our performances.

We also had seniors who participated in Dansville FFA activities throughout the year including: attending Regional and State workshops and conventions, making apple cider, raising broiler chickens, and collecting sap to make maple syrup.

Congratulations to Nathan Sherwood, who was a finalist for Regional Star Farmer in 2025 and in 2026, won the Ag Olympics and received the Silver State Degree at State Convention as one of the top 50 Supervised Agricultural Experiences in the State.

These seniors have also had great success as student-athletes, with **13** of them being honored as CMAC Scholar-Athletes this year. **Several** of these seniors were part of the Volleyball & Boys Basketball teams which earned Academic All-State Team Honors. **Taylor Doerr & Joey McMillan** both have roster spots to continue competing in sports at the collegiate level. **7** of our senior athletes earned a CMAC All-League designation; **1** earned All-Area; **Taylor Doerr, Margo Kuznicki, Hope Service, Madyson Smith & Maggie vanHartesvelt** were Academic All-State, and none of that includes the accolades we will surely see this Spring.

And they don't stop there. This class will leave with hundreds of thousands of dollars in scholarships and grants to pursue furthering their education. Many of them are receiving the Community College Guarantee or the Michigan Achievement Scholarship through the State of Michigan to help pay for their post-secondary plans. **16** of these seniors plan to attend a community college to obtain their Associate's degrees in various programs, **18** students plan to attend a four-year university to obtain Bachelor's degrees, **6** students are joining apprenticeship/work-based programs, **1** intends to serve in the armed forces, and **2** plan to join the rest of us in the workforce.



2. **Credit Recovery:** In the month of June, some high school students are working in summer school to recover credits toward graduation. Several have already finished and a few more should be done by the end of the month.
3. **Bullying 2026:** The district has adopted this definition from the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program to use when handling student conflict: "Bullying is when someone repeatedly and on purpose says or does mean or hurtful things to another person who as a hard time defending himself or herself. The three key components of bullying behavior are: (1) Involves an imbalance of power and strength; (2) Involves a pattern of behavior over time; and (3) Involves an aggressive behavior."

There were **zero** instances of bullying at Dansville High School during the 2025-2026 school year.
