Inclement Weather Procedures



Severe Thunderstorm Watch

All students will be dismissed at the regular time unless updated to a warning.



Severe Thunderstorm Warning

All students may be detained if severe weather conditions exist at time of dismissal.



Tornado Watch

- Teaching and learning will continue as scheduled.
- Students will be dismissed at the regular time unless updated to a warning.
- If a tornado watch is issued while outdoor activities are in progress, the students, participants, audience, and attendees will be dismissed. The activities will stop immediately.
- After school activities may be held if such outdoor activities are scheduled to begin one hour after a tornado watch has been lifted.



Tornado Warning

- All students will be kept at school if the warning is issued during the school day and will be instructed to take shelter within the building until the ALL CLEAR is signaled.
- Students will not be sent home, nor will they be released to parents.
- If a tornado warning occurs outside of school hours, the district will not begin any school activities (i.e., athletics, PTO, Aggie Aid, etc.).
- If a tornado warning is issued while the activities are in progress, the students, participants, audience, and attendees will seek shelter within the building immediately.
- After school activities may be held if such activities are scheduled to begin one hour after a tornado warning has been lifted.



Winter Weather

- Weather related data for closings is collected by 5:45 a.m.
- Based on the data collected, the superintendent then decides on school closures.
- The decision will be posted as soon as possible via ParentSquare and Facebook.
 Announcements will be made on most Lansing-area radio and TV stations.
- A decision will be made early in the afternoon regarding cancelling of high school evening programs, including athletic events and practices.
- All middle school athletic events, practices, and games are cancelled in the event of a school closure.



Temperature

School will be closed if wind chills are sustained at -20°.



Thank you for making this year's Fifth Grade Camp an incredible success! We can't wait to continue this beloved tradition for years to come.




Kindergarten Round-Up
