We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Dansville Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not been given one of these labels.

Dansville Elementary School is the only elementary building in the district housing Developmental Kindergarten through fifth grade. Dansville Schools does not contain any specialized schools.Dansville Elementary's School Improvement Plan consists of four main goals. Our goals are to improve student proficiency in all content areas through increased rigor, students will develop healthy physical, social and emotional lifelong habits, as well as becoming proficient with skills in literacy and social studies. Each of these goals has specific, research-based strategies linked to them to ensure adequate progress is being achieved.
