We did it! Together, we made it through this year of pandemic learning!

Two celebrations that bookend our district are that our in-person kindergartners did not miss a single day of school this year for the purpose of quarantining and that our seniors had an in-person, beautiful graduation experience on Fuller Field at the end of the year!

More Celebrations

With deep gratitude to our community for their support of the bond, we also celebrated the completion of the last of our "new" spaces with grand opening celebrations as we opened the soccer, softball and baseball fields!

Academic Achievement

In spite of all that has happened, our students grew, in some cases more this year than in past years, on the math subskills that were measured in the fall, winter and spring!

This speaks volumes about the efforts our teachers made to make this academic achievement possible both in person and online. It also shines a spotlight on our students, who demonstrated grit and determination to be Aggie Achievers!

Our graduating class also excelled academically as we honored the achievement of Elizabeth Troia who earned the elite status of being named a National Merit Finalist and the Class of 2021 was led by five students who graduated with a perfect 4.0 gpa and were named valedictorians — Rachel Briggs, Maddie Mays, Reanna Minnis, Madison Sorenson and Elizabeth Troia.

District Improvement Progress

While also learning how to teach students both online and in-person, our teachers and staff rose to the challenge of continuing to work on the areas we identified for improvement for this year.

- Our Math team completed work related to identifying and encouraging proper math language, created systems to help improve the math talk between students during Spring Math and created visible displays for the classrooms to help reinforce all of this work for students and teachers. Parent communication tools were also developed to help parents better understand Spring Math.
- Our **Rigor** team worked on helping teachers

develop online assessments, examined the Teaching and Assessment Expectations Guide to make sure it was updated and used it to train new teachers.

- Our **Relevance and Relationships** team was able to pull off our first fully virtual career day at the end of March and some of our students have reported that they have determined their future plans based on the impact this event had on them! Our teachers implemented an Advisory time in MS and HS to create an avenue to be more connected with students and staff worked together to share ways to increase student engagement both online and in-person.
- Our Social Studies team started up in February and began reading a number of articles to deepen our understanding about how several issues in our society related to social studies standards are viewed through different lenses.

One of the most cherished parts of our graduation ceremony is when the seniors take their class flower to family, staff and friends who made a significant impact on their journey — the Flower Ceremony. It is always accompanied by tears when heartfelt gratitude is shared while the class song plays.

There is a lot of mean-spirited, divisive energy in our world lately, so I am personally committing to doing this to help spread kindness and gratitude and I'm making my deadline the end of July.






Welcome Jeff Dassance
