# Honoring Aggie Retirees

## Sue Provencal and Amy Hodgson



Before coming to Dansville, **Sue Provencal** spent 19 years as a classroom teacher and six years as a reading teacher. She joined the Aggie Family in 2009 as the K-5 reading specialist, in charge of our Title I program for reading intervention and support. Sue worked with hundreds of elementary-aged Aggies during her time here, helping them improve and grow as young readers. Sue also was the force behind the wildly popular parent/student book club which integrated art into a collaborative shared reading experience each year. She completed 13 years in this crucial role for our students in Dansville this May.

"It has been an absolute joy teaching at Dansville. Leaving this wonderful, supportive community has made retiring bittersweet," said Sue.

Sue plans to spend her retirement spoiling her grandchildren, traveling with her husband, and opening her own tutoring business.



**Amy Hodgson** worked as a teacher and administrator for 30 years. Amy began her career as a middle and high school science teacher and basketball coach in Fowlerville, and was a finalist for the 2003 Michigan Teacher of the Year. Amy served as both an assistant principal (in Howell) and as the Dansville High School principal, prior to being hired as the superintendent and curriculum director for Dansville Schools in June of 2010.

Serving in these roles for Dansville Schools, Amy facilitated the implementation of many 21st century learning initiatives and spearheaded the implementation of standards-based grading and assessment K-12, district-wide Aggie Improvement

Teams on which all teachers are members and developed a school improvement cycle of continuous improvement, including robust use of data, state reporting and annual reporting of the work of the Aggie Improvement Teams to the Board of Education. In 2014 Amy was awarded an UCEA/MSU College of Education Excellence in Educational Leadership Award for these efforts and was **just recently awarded the 2020 Nancy A. Colflesh Distinguished Alumni Award, presented by EAD Faculty at Michigan State University.**

Amy helped bring the community together to pass the 2016 bond proposal that led to the building of our new high school and several other renovations and improvements throughout the district, including the "spaceship room" housed in the elementary school.
