## **High School Celebrations**

This holiday season our students, staff, and community worked together to support 45 families with food at Thanksgiving and gifts at Christmas. **Winter Homecoming was a great success!** We tried a few new events and they were highly engaging. Mr. Bramlet hosted a dodge ball tournament all week with a bracket being run at lunch Monday through Thursday, culminating in a Championship match against the teachers at our pep assembly on Friday! A few classes participated and then the teachers brought back some oldies with their performance.

The Flamazing Pond of Fame was created to encourage seniors to complete the Free Application for Federal Student aid (FAFSA) to receive scholarships, grants, work-study opportunities, and loans for college and trade schools. Once a student completes the application, they receive a flamingo that they get to write their name on and hang it on the Flamazing Pond of Fame. They are also given a flamingo-themed goodie bag. The pond helps motivate students to complete the FAFSA and introduces the application to juniors and underclassmen. We had the highest percentage complete in the county in mid January. In January, the school counselor and college and career advisor have been meeting with each high school student for one-minute meetings. The purpose of the meetings, is to continue building individual relationships with students, provide support where needed, and discuss their post-secondary plans. We are also continuing to support students as they complete the FAFSA, college and trade school applications, scholarship applications, and explore career options through Xello as students continue to build student's Education Development Plans (EDPs).
