SUPERINTENDENT UPDATE

Dear Aggie Family,

The school community is blessed to be able to celebrate two new years: each August when students return from summer break and once more when our students return in January. We have two opportunities to reflect on the past and two opportunities to resolve to do even better than before. And while January is not the beginning of a new school year, it marks the beginning of a fresh chapter and a new semester, and I am thrilled to share some exciting updates and reflections with you.





First, I want to thank everyone for your grace and understanding as we navigate ongoing staffing issues. This is not unique to Dansville Schools. Districts in our region and across the state continue to have difficulty finding qualified candidates, especially for hard-to-fill positions such as foreign language and special education. Dansville Schools has partnered with several organizations whose mission is to recruit and certify nontraditional teachers. This could be individuals who have degrees in other majors (ie - general studies, marketing, business, etc.), but have since felt a calling to teach. We can often hire individuals, place them in classrooms, and mentor them while they are working toward their certification outside of the school day.

We are already in the process of planning for the 2024-25 school year. If you know someone who has thought about making a career change, let them know about this opportunity. Open positions could be posted as early as March.



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COMING SOON!

Dansville Schools is the process of changing the platform in which we communicate with our families. We are phasing out SchoolMessenger which sends out our mass email communications and robocalls. We will be launching a new program called ParentSquare beginning this summer. Not only will this program send out emails and robocalls, but it will also utilize text messaging. Principals, teachers, advisors, and coaches will be using ParentSquare to send communications. Imagine that: All messages from the district will be through one app on your phone! No need to check Remind for one class, Heja for athletics, Seesaw for your younger child, and so on. This is exciting news!



ParentSquare will offer families other options as well, including the ability to report their child's absence via the app and the ability to add caregivers to school closing notifications.

We've targeted the middle school and spring athletic programs to pilot ParentSquare beginning in late February / early March, so those families should look for that information to come home soon. We will launch the full program district-wide in time for the 2024-2025 school year.

School Improvement:

Our teachers continue to focus on these essential elements for the 2023-2024 school year:

- improving math proficiency
- ensuring our newest teachers are trained in best instructional and assessment practices
- supporting the "whole" Aggie through school safety initiatives, community engagement, and staff and student wellness
- increasing student proficiency in language arts through the implementation of a new elementary reading curriculum

Innovation in Education:

We are committed to embracing innovation in education. In the coming months, we will be looking deeply at technology integration. We have a small committee looking at current practices, studying technology standards, and helping to design a vision for technology integration moving forward. We absolutely know and understand that technology integration is not putting a device in front of students for hours everyday. At Dansville Schools, we value the importance of social interaction and hands-on opportunities while balancing the need to equip our students for an ever-changing, globally connected society. We are excited to partner with our friends at Dansville Schools Education Foundation who have devoted their past two fundraisers to financially support this endeavor.





SAT Prep:

This year we continued to add to our existing testing prep efforts by utilizing Dorm (Advisory) time to prepare for spring testing. We had weekly challenge problems, timed competitions, and continued our usual practice tests and sessions to help them feel more comfortable and ready for the tests they would take. We adopted Khan Academy activities for warm-ups and mini-lessons across the content areas and are encouraging students to use them when they have free time to help bolster their confidence and abilities.

College and Career Prep:


The Flamazing Pond of Fame was created to encourage seniors to complete the Free Application for Federal Student aid (FAFSA) to receive scholarships, grants, work-study opportunities, and loans for college and trade schools. Once a student completes the application, they receive a flamingo that they get to write their name on and then hang it in the Flamzing Pond of Fame. They are also given a flamingo-themed goodie bag. The pond helps motivate students to complete the FAFSA and introduces the application to juniors and underclassmen. We had the highest percentage complete in the county in mid January.

In January, the school counselor has been met with each high school student for one-minute meetings. The purpose of the meetings was to continue building individual relationships with students, provide support where needed, and discuss their post-secondary plans. We are also continuing to support students as they complete the FAFSA, college and trade school applications, scholarship applications, and explore career options through Xello as students continue to build Education Development Plans (EDPs).

DANSVILLE ELEMENTARY UPDATE

- Students and Staff had a great time celebrating the holidays with elf mischief, class parties, visits from Auggie the Aggie, and our all-school sing along!
- FastBridge and Spring Math screening has been in full swing the past two weeks. This is an important time to get a quick check on student progress as we compare their results to their fall data. Decisions will then be made about additional interventions needed to support student growth such as Summer School, classroom interventions, and/or time with an Instructional Aide.
- Kindergarten and Begindergarten Round-Up will be held on February 22nd from 4:00-6:00 in the elementary school. Please spread the word to anyone you know who may have a student turning 5 by September 1 (for Kindergarten) or turning 5 before Dec. 1 (for Begindergarten).
